An Ordinance

Regulating the width of pavements on Main Street, the removal of trees and obstructions in side walks, and the trimming of trees, in the Borough of Alburtis.

Section I. Be it ordained and enacted by the Town Council of the Borough of Alburtis, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the authority of the same, that the minimum width of all side walks on Main Street, in the Borough of Alburtis, Lehigh County, Pennsylvania, shall be six (6) feet from the outer edge of the curb.

Section II. All persons and property owners are hereby required to remove all trees and other obstructions within the space prescribed and set apart for side walks within the Borough of Alburtis, except such trees, poles, posts, etc., as the Borough may permit immediately inside the curb on five days' notice.

Section III. All trees on or within the highways or side walks of said Borough shall be trimmed and kept trimmed to a height of twelve (12) feet clear above the surface of said highways and side walks.

Section IV. Any persons violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction before the Burgess or one of the Justices of the Peace of said Borough, be fined not less than \$10.00 nor more than \$100.00, and in default of payment of the same, committed to the Lehigh County prison one day for each dollar of fine imposed.
