ORDINANCE NO. 138

An Ordinance providing for the location, adoption and establishing of the alignment widths and grades for Chestnut Street from the southerly property line of Stone Alley and the northerly property line of Wood Alley, more particularly described as follows, to wit:

All that certain lot, piece of ground and area,

Beginning at a point in line of intersection of the southerly property line of Stone Alley (18 feet wide) and the easterly property line of Chestnut Street (33 feet wide); thence along the easterly property line of Chestnut Street, South 1° 30' East, 19.79 feet to a point; thence along the same South 17° 30' East 560.11 feet to the northerly property line of Wood Alley; thence crossing Chestnut Street South 72° 30' West 33.00 feet to the Westerly property line of Chestnut Street; thence along the westerly property line of Chestnut Street, North 17° 30' West 564.75 feet to a point; thence along the same North 1° 30' West 24.35 feet to the southerly property line of Stone Alley; thence crossing Chestnut Street North 88° East 33.00 feet to the point of beginning.

Being the same premises which Raymond F. Scherer and Ursula W. Scherer, Miriam Tews, Donald C. Bilger and Lillian M. Bilger, Raymond W. Adams and Rhea M. Adams by their deed dated May 24, 1965 and recorded in the Office for the Recording of Deeds in and for the County of Lehigh at Allentown, Pennsylvania in Miscellaneous Book Volume 324, page 579 granted and conveyed to the BOROUGH OF ALBURTIS.

SECTION I- The thoroughfare known as Chestnut Street from its intersection with Stone Alley southwardly to its intersection with Wood Alley, a distance of approximately 565 feet, be located and adopted, and the alignment, widths and grades for the same be and are hereby established in conformity with the description hereinbefore set forth.
