Ordinance No. 600

(Duly Adopted October 8, 2025)

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A NEW HANDICAPPED PARKING SPACE ON THE SOUTHERLY SIDE OF MOTY DRIVE NEAR 326 MOTY DRIVE, SETTING THE FEE FOR A POLICE ACCIDENT REPORT TO FIFTEEN DOLLARS (\$15.00), AND AMENDING CODIFIED ORDINANCES § 12-607(b) (RELATING TO EMPLOYMENT DUTIES OF UCC AND PROPERTY MAINTENANCE CODE OFFICIALS) TO INCLUDE FIRE CODE OFFICIALS.

WHEREAS, Borough Council has received an application for a handicapped parking space to accommodate the parking needs of a person with a disability residing at 326 Moty Drive; and

WHEREAS, Council desires to establish such a handicapped parking space for a limited period of time; and

WHEREAS, 75 PA. CONS. STAT. § 3751(b)(2) provides that the maximum fee for a police accident report in municipalities other than Philadelphia is fifteen dollars (\$15,00); and

WHEREAS, by Ordinance 599 (adopted September 10, 2025), Council adopted a Fire Code and provided for officials to conduct inspections under and enforce the Fire Code; and

WHEREAS, on October 1, 2025, the Borough published a public notice in the *East Penn Press*, a newspaper of general circulation in the Borough of Alburtis, of its intention to consider and adopt this Ordinance on October 8, 2025;

Now, Therefore, be it **Ordained** and **Enacted** by the Borough Council of the Borough of Alburtis, Lehigh County, Pennsylvania, as follows:

SECTION 1. Codified Ordinances § 41-802 (relating to Traffic Control—Handicapped Parking Spaces—Designated Spaces) is amended as follows (with deletions indicated by strike-outs and insertions indicated by double underlining):

§ 41-802 Designated Spaces—Residential.

The following spaces are designated handicapped parking spaces. A particular disabled person is identified for each space, and the designation shall remain in effect until the expiration date for that space, unless terminated sooner by motion or resolution of Council. Unless otherwise indicated below, the length of the space shall be twenty-two (22) feet, and the center of the space shall be the point where the street curbline intersects the center-line of the sidewalk or other access-way used by the disabled person to access the dwelling on the designated property:

SECTION 2. As provided in Codified Ordinances § 41-104 (relating to Traffic Control—General Provisions—Official Signs), the Borough shall erect and maintain official traffic control devices for all locations ordained under Codified Ordinances § 41-802 as amended by this Ordinance, in accordance with regulations of the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation; and as provided in Codified Ordinances § 41-803 (relating to Traffic Control—Handicapped Parking Spaces—Signs), all official traffic control devices erected and maintained in connection with the handicapped parking spaces designated under this Ordinance shall state the penalty provided by law for violations and state that vehicles in violation may be towed.

<u>SECTION 3</u>. Codified Ordinances § 7-106 (relating to Departments—Police Department—Accident Report Fee) is amended as follows (with deletions indicated by <u>strike</u>outs and insertions indicated by <u>double underlining</u>):

§ 7-106 Accident Report Fee.

The fee for a copy of an accident report shall be Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) <u>Fifteen Dollars</u> (\$15.00).

SECTION 4. Codified Ordinances § 12-607(b) (relating to Personnel Policies— Employment Duties—Zoning and Code Officials—UCC and Property Maintenance Code Officials) is amended as follows (with deletions indicated by strike-outs and insertions indicated by double underlining):

(b) UCC and Property Maintenance Code Officials. The Code Officials, plan reviewers, and inspectors engaged by the Borough in its administration of the Uniform Construction Code (see Chapter 30), the Fire Code (see Chapter 34), the Property Maintenance Code (see Chapter 35), and, where applicable, the Building Code (see Chapter 31) and the Plumbing Code (see Chapter 32), shall perform all of the duties for which they were engaged as provided in the respective Codes, and such other duties as may be agreed from time to time with Council.
