

AN ORDINANCE FIXING THE SALARIES, BONDS AND DUTIES OF BOROUGH OFFICIALS AND EMPLOYEES.

SECTION I- BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the BOROUGH OF ALBURTIS that the following mentioned offices be and the same are hereby acknowledged or created, for the faithful performance by the holders of these offices, of the duties and functions thereof, subject to the requirements and conditions fixed by law, or ordinance, or imposed or agreed upon at the time of appointment, and that the following compensation is hereby fixed:

Borough Engineer	500.00 per annum
Maintenance-Supervisor	13,625.04 per annum

Patrolman	3.18 per hour
Asst. Chief of Police	3.29 per hour
Laborer	3.71 per hour
Zoning Officer	318.00 per annum
Electrician & Plumber	Prevailing Rates
Mayor	240.00 per annum
Councilman	20.00 per month

SECTION II - The compensations, salaries and bonds fixed under this ordinance may be changed by Council, by motion, regularly passed, and any appointments hereunder (in the case where Council has the power to dismiss) may be dismissed at any time by Council. The intent of this ordinance being that the offices subject to regular appointment, together with salaries and bonds as may herein be also designated, shall be in force until Council, my motion or ordinance shall otherwise designate.

SECTION III - The holders of the following offices shall be required to have fidelity bonds posted with the Borough in principal amounts as set forth. Coverage shall be secured and premiums paid by the Borough.

SECTION IV - Any ordinance conflicting in whole or in part with this ordinance is hereby repealed.
