

**BOROUGH OF ALBURTIS
LEHIGH COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA**

Ordinance No. 298

(Duly Adopted April 28, 1993)

AN ORDINANCE DESIGNATING A NO PARKING AREA AND A
ONE HOUR PARKING AREA ON THE EASTERLY SIDE OF MAIN
STREET IN THE BOROUGH OF ALBURTIS.

WHEREAS, Sections 3353(d), and 6109(a)(1), (b), (d), and (e) of the Vehicle Code, 75 PA. CONS. STAT. §§ 3353(d), 6109(a)(1),(b),(d),(e), and chapters 201 (in particular § 201.21) and 211 (in particular § 211.6) of the Transportation Department regulations, title 67 of the Pennsylvania Code, permit municipalities to prohibit, regulate, limit, or restrict stopping, standing, or parking of vehicles on any highway within their physical boundaries, if the designation is made by ordinance, and, with regard to certain regulations, in accordance with an engineering and traffic investigation which complies with state regulations; and

WHEREAS, parking may be restricted by the Borough without an engineering and traffic investigation to eliminate parking in excess of a specified time limit (67 PA. CODE § 201.21(e)); and

WHEREAS, parking may be prohibited by the Borough in accordance with an engineering and traffic investigation conducted under state regulations if any the criteria of 67 PA. CODE § 201.21(b) are satisfied, which includes a finding that the available corner sight distance for a driver on the minor road is less than the appropriate minimum stopping sight distance value specified under state regulations for the driver on a through roadway; and

WHEREAS, the Borough may establish new stopping, standing, or parking restrictions on State-designated highways within their physical boundaries without approval from the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (67 PA. CODE § 201.21(g)); and

WHEREAS, the Borough has conducted an engineering and traffic investigation under the state regulations and concluded that a parking prohibition as set forth in this Ordinance is warranted and should be established as set forth in this Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the Borough has determined that a one-hour parking restriction as set forth in this Ordinance should be established.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it **ORDAINED** and **ENACTED** by the Borough Council of the Borough of Alburts, Lehigh County, Pennsylvania, as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 129-25 of the Code of the Borough of Alburts, as added and reserved by Ordinance 290 (adopted April 8, 1992), shall be amended to read as follows:

§ 129-25. Parking Restrictions.

The following parking restrictions are hereby established. Violations of these restrictions shall be treated, for purposes of §§ 129-3 and 129-16, in the same manner as violations of § 129-2A (relating to prohibited parking):

A. No Parking Zones

1. South Main Street (SR 3001), easterly side from the northern curblineline of East Second Street north for a distance of sixty-five (65) feet.

B. One-Hour Parking Zones (6 a.m. to 9 p.m. Sunday through Saturday)

No vehicle shall be parked in the following locations for a continuous period of longer than one hour at any time between 6:00 a.m. and 9:00 p.m. on any day of the week. To the extent 75 PA. CONS. STAT. ANN. § 3353 prohibits parking at any location within a One-Hour Parking Zone set forth below, the state parking prohibition shall take precedence over the following one-hour parking restrictions:

1. South Main Street (SR 3001), easterly side from the southern curblineline of East Second Street south to the intersection with Franklin Street.

SECTION 2. The Borough shall erect and/or maintain official traffic control devices at all locations ordained under § 129-25 of the Code of the Borough of Alburdis, as added by Section 1 of this Ordinance, in accordance with regulations of the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation.
